One of the devotees of my Guru Maharaj was given Sanyas by my Gurudev and was asked by the latter to go on a travel in Uttarakhand with only one rupee in his hand. He as also told that during the travel, if anybody asked a question which involved an answer in the negative, i.e. 'no', he should not reply. In other words, a negative word should not come out of his mouth.

On the way to Kedarnath, several people asked that Swamiji as to whether he had taken his food but he kept quiet as no negative answer could be given. Thus, the most of the way he starved and was feeling hungry as well as weak. On the way, he found a Dharmsala in the verandah of which people were sleeping in the morning.

As Swamiji was hungry, he also began to sleep in a vacant space in the verandah.

By about noon, he woke up as somebody was pulling at his bedsheet. He saw a well dressed Brahmin wearing ashes all over the body who asked the Swamiji whether he would like to come and have food. As the question did not involve any negative answer, he answered hurriedly, "Yes, yes."

He alone was taken inside and was asked to be seated over in a seat with and plate in front of him. He was served with hot rice, chapattis, vegetables and dal.
